The adoption of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development by the United Nations General Assembly in 2015, the adoption of the New Urban Agenda in 2016 and other key international agreements established new policy frameworks for future activities on sustainable housing and urban development at all levels. Above all, an integrated and coordinated approach at the global, regional, national, subnational and sub-regional levels, with the participation of all relevant stakeholders, is required for meeting the commitments in the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, the New Urban Agenda and others.



New Urban Agenda

HOUSING AND LAND MANAGEMENT

- New Urban Agenda adopted October 2016 in Quito, Ecuador
- Commitments made:
 - Provide basic services for all citizens
 - Ensure that all citizens have access to equal opportunities and face no discrimination
 - Promote measures that support cleaner cities
 - Strengthen resilience in cities to reduce the risk and the impact of disasters
 - Take action to address climate change by reducing their greenhouse gas emissions
 - Fully respect the rights of refugees, migrants and internally displaced persons regardless of their migration status
 - Improve connectivity and support innovative and green initiatives
 - Promote safe, accessible and green public spaces



UNECE approach to cooperation

Promoting:

- Strong institutions, promoting stakeholder involvement, establishment of partnerships,
- Strengthening data driven and indicator based review process and
- Application of innovative financial mechanisms to support the implementation process
- Capacity building and establishment of effective platforms for international cooperation and exchange of best practices

Evidence-based policies

- The United Nations Development Account (UNDA) project "Evidence-based policies for sustainable housing and urban development in selected countries with economies in transition" is been carried out in collaboration with UN-Habitat in 2017-2019.
- The project supports efforts of the governments to collect and analyse data and information on housing and urban development needed for the development and implementation of specific policies.
- Guidelines based on the analysis of the situation in the countries, are being developed. The guidelines include the methodology for data collection relevant to the 2030 Agenda and New Urban Agenda.
- Advisory missions and national trainings are organised in Albania, Georgia, Kyrgyzstan and Ukraine, where using examples of specific policy documents, national authorities are trained in collecting and analysis data for evidence based policy making.


